PLENARY 6 NORTHEASTERN JURISDICITON MINUTES JULY 11, 2024

Call to Order

Bishop Hector A. Burgos-Nunez called the plenary to order. He was assisted by Bishop John Schol and Bishop Jane Middleton.

Bishop Burgos-Nunez indicated that the next order of business will be to consider Resolution #3 calling on the annual conferences of the NEJ to require the use of United Methodist resources when readmitting disaffiliated churches into the United Methodist Church. This resolution encourages our Annual Conferences to use formal United Methodist resources when admitting congregations that have disaffiliated from The United Methodist Church to ensure they understand the commitments of being United Methodist.

Before being able to discuss Resolution #3, Bishop recognizes Robin Hynicka, Clergy Delegate from Eastern PA. He is requesting a declaratory decision on the following question:

"May an annual conference create an adopt a rule to determine the eligibility of a delegate to jurisdictional and/or general conference who is actively serving and/or providing leadership in a denomination not in full communion with the United Methodist Church."

Bishop indicated the declaratory decision is in order.

Creed Progue, lay delegate from Greater New Jersey ask a question about clarification on the current Book of Discipline passed at General Conference regarding the issue that Robin Hynicka raised in his declaratory decision? Bishop indicated that the chair does not have access to the information that Mr. Progue was asking and it would be impossible to get the information.

Bishop asked Mr. Hynicka to read again his declaratory decision so all may hear what the body is voting on. Bishop indicated that this is not debatable and the body will move directly into a vote.

VOTE: YES − 91; NO − 48.

It will be forwarded to the Judicial Council.

Bishop recognized Elizabeth Santos Fisher, lay, EPA for a point of order. She referenced ¶251.2 of The Discipline regarding qualifications listed in ¶27 and ask if it was legal to pass a resolution regarding qualifications for disbarring the election of someone who is in good standing.

The Bishop ruled that the body has not done that and it is a moot question and it will not be considered.

Bishop announced that the body is now at a hard stop and must recess for lunch. Bishop Burgos Nunez recognized Katie Reimer, lay delegate New York for a moment of personal privilege to speak about the Thursday in Black which is a global movement led by the World Council of Churches.

Bishop indicated that after lunch delegates would gather in their new Episcopal areas. He called on Judi Kenaston to give instructions. It is hoped that each area will talk about a vision for their area in the future, what needs to happen and secondly, the COE would like your input in terms of a name for the Episcopal area.

The Conference Secretary gave the room locations for each Episcopal area.

The Episcopal areas will meet at 1:15 and the chair reminded the body that we will resume as a total body at 2:40 pm.
