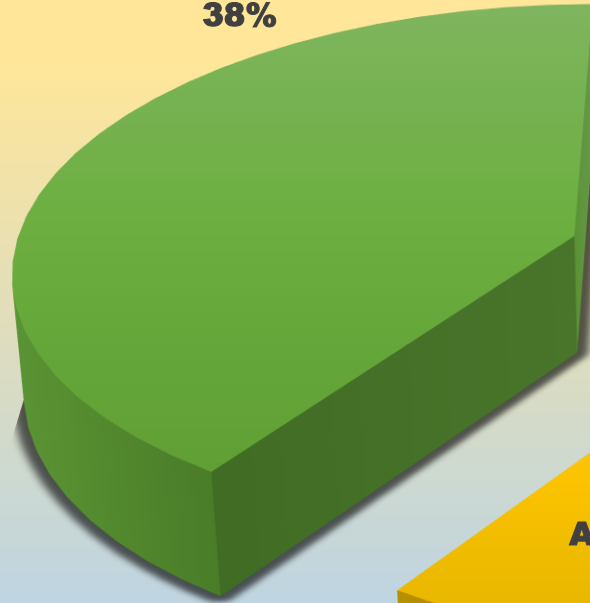

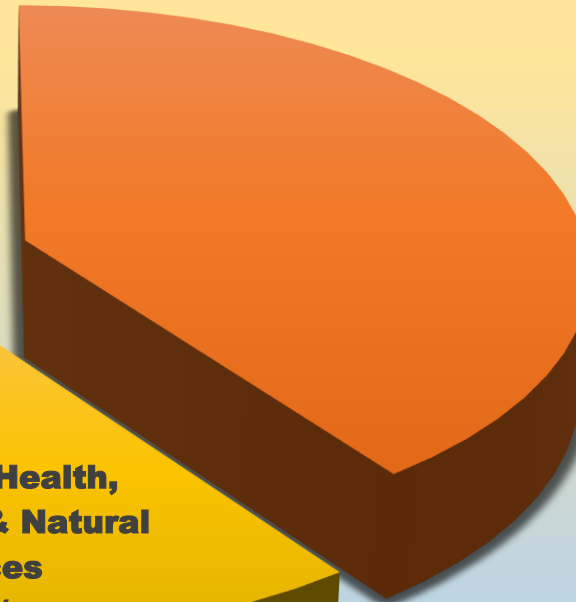

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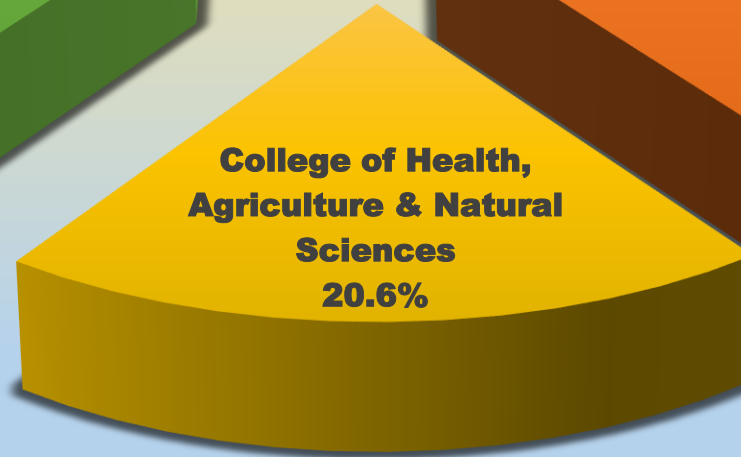

- ❑ **Wehnam Dabale and Claudine Migisha, Nigeria and Democratic Republic of Congo:** Wehnam is the International Students Advisor and Claudine is a June 2019 graduate. Orphaned at six, she has earned a degree in Psychology and leads youth empowerment efforts in her community.
- ❑ **Chipso Zoe Chikomo, Zimbabwe:** A 2016 beneficiary of the Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders. She is the country director for “*Girls for Days Zimbabwe*”—which aims to create a more dignified, free and educated world through access to sustainable feminine hygiene solutions. She is also the executive director of Nhangwa Trust.
- ❑ **Elisha Friday Ishaya, Nigeria:** A perioperative nurse at Federal Medical Centre Keffi, an official coronavirus care center.

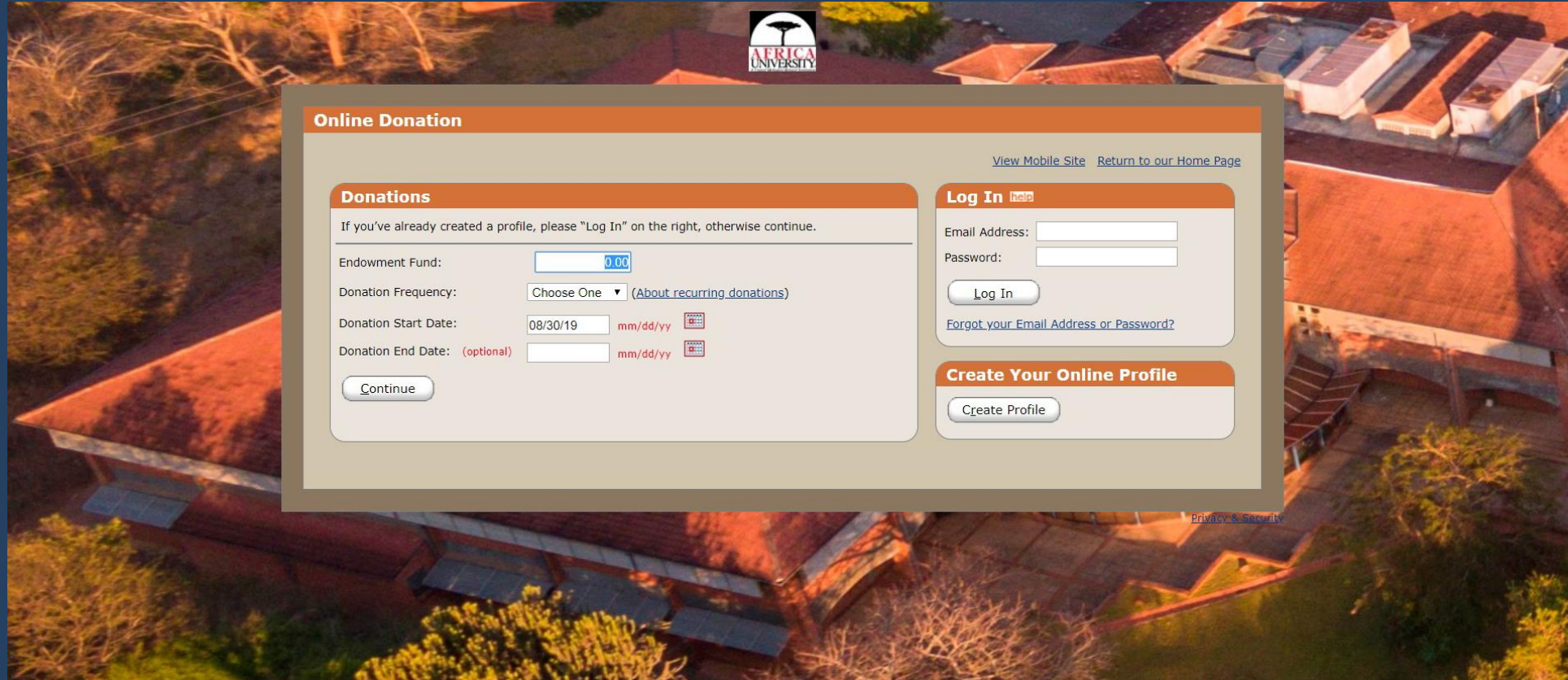
